NON-DEGREE STUDY PROGRAM BIBLE CERTIFICATE

ONSITE / ONLINE

The Bible Certificate program is designed to engage the learner in an overview of the Bible and theology, major themes, and historical, geographical and theological settings; also, there is an introduction to methods of Bible study and the principles of biblical interpretation, and introduction to core doctrines of the faith, such as God, Jesus, Holy Spirit, and the Church.

Participants enroll as part-time students, and may progress at their own pace and as courses are available, either onsite or online. Certificate programs require courses be taken "for credit", however any course or courses may be taken as a non-credit "audit" at a reduced charge but without a formal certificate awarded. Students may wish to augment their study program with additional courses of interest, either for credit or audit, depending on long-range goals.



- Five-Week intensive, accelerated format, meeting on-campus in Rochester from 6:00 - 10:00pm one night each week
- Most classes are scheduled Tuesday evenings, but some are also offered on Monday or Thursday evenings as needed
- Generally, students take only one course at a time, but some do double up classes, depending on their schedules and responsibilities
- Coursework requires personal initiative, with a high level of reading and writing for each class
- Professors and instructors are experienced in their field of study,
 and available as needed for one-on-one interaction
- Smaller class sizes, intentionally
- Extensive library and comfortable student center available each evening





- Six-Week or more intensive, accelerated format, available anywhere with the internet, with 24/7 access to the class content and online research tools
- Generally, students take only one course at a time, but some have found they
 are able to handle two online courses at one time
- Web-based access for course content, assignments, and class discussions
- Professors and instructors are experienced in their field of study, and available as needed for consultation; students and instructors have all found great community forms within that electronic environment
- Daily interaction is expected; expect an average of 4-8 hours of coursework each week of class
- Coursework requires personal discipline, with high level of reading and writing, including online discussion forums
